From July 31 to August 7, 73 students and 5 faculty members from five universities in Korea, Taiwan, and Thailand visited Shibaura to participate in a large-scale eight-day design workshop. This year's theme was "Reinterpreting Tea Culture." Each group explored ways to experience the tea culture of their own country and proposed ideas to help younger generations better understand and engage with tea in contemporary society. Through visits to cafés and tea-related venues in Tokyo, the groups shared their observations and discussed insights, which led to a wide range of innovative proposals. A total of 19 group presentations were made, showcasing many fresh ideas that could only emerge through cross-cultural collaboration and perspectives.
